Flashcards Series 1

Saludos y Despedidas

Flashcards are one of the quickest and easiest ways to test yourself on Spanish vocabulary, no matter where you are!

Setting Up

- ▶ Print this file. (In Adobe Acrobat, go to File > Print.)
- ▶ Cut each of the following pages into 6 pieces on the solid lines shown.
- ▶ Fold each of the 6 pieces in half on the dotted line, then tape the open edge.
- ▶ Have pen and paper on hand to write your answers on.

Game Play

Single Person

- ▶ Shuffle the flashcards so that they are in random order.
- ▶ Place all of the folded cards in a pile with the Spanish side up.
- ▶ Starting from the top of the pile, write down the translation of the Spanish word or phrase in English on your sheet of paper.
- ▶ Check your answers and give yourself 1 point for every correct one. Subtract a point for every incorrect one. Note down your score.
- ▶ Shuffle the flashcards again and repeat the process, but with the English side up.
- ▶ Score yourself. At first, aim to get a positive score. Once you become more proficient, aim to get a score of 10.

Two or More People

- ▶ Shuffle the cards and place them in a pile in the center of the group with the English side up.
- ▶ Take the flashcard at the top of the pile and show it to the person on your left.
- ▶ That person has to guess the Spanish translation of the phrase and say it aloud. A correct answer gets 1 point, while an incorrect answer gets -1.
- ▶ BONUS: If the other person says the English sentence in Spanish, they get 2 bonus points. An incorrect answer will not detract from their score.
- ▶ That is the end of their turn. Now, the person to your left picks up the next card and shows the picture to the person on their left, and so on, until all the flashcards have been completed.
- ▶ You can repeat the process by using the reverse side of the cards up (the Spanish).
- ▶ The person with the highest score wins.



Buenos días.

Por ejemplo:
Buenos días, señorita.



Good morning.

For example:
Good morning, miss.



Estoy enfermo.

Por ejemplo:
No voy a trabajar, estoy enfermo.



I'm sick.

For example:
I'm not going to work, I'm sick.



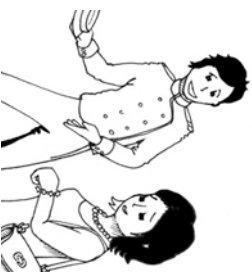
Buenas tardes.

Por ejemplo:
Buenas tardes, Señor Delgado.



Good afternoon.

For example:
Good afternoon, Mr. Delgado.



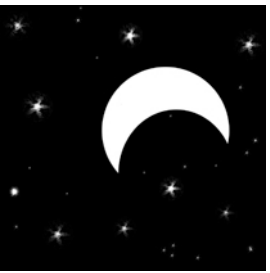
¿Cómo está usted?

Por ejemplo:
Buenos días, señora, ¿cómo está usted?



How are you? (polite)

For example:
Good morning, ma'am, how are you?



Buenas noches.

Por ejemplo:
Buenas noches, Señora Vargas.



Good evening.

For example:
Good evening, Mrs. Vargas.



¿Cómo estás?

Por ejemplo:
Hola, Pepe. ¿cómo estás? .



How are you? (casual)

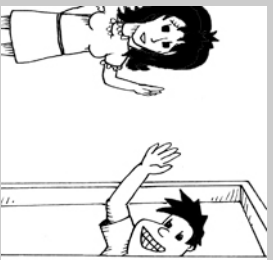
For example:
Hello, Pepe, how are you?



¡Hasta pronto!

Por ejemplo:

Tengo que irme. ¡Hasta pronto!



See you soon!

For example:

I have to go. See you soon!



Muy bien.

Por ejemplo:

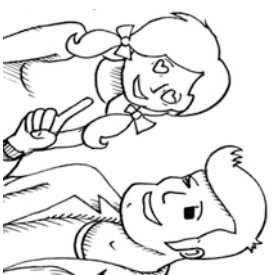
Estoy muy bien, gracias.



Very well.

For example:

I'm very well, thank you.



¡Hasta luego!

Por ejemplo:

Bueno, chica, ¡hasta luego!



See ya later!

For example:

Well, girl, see ya later!



Necesito ayuda.

Por ejemplo:

Perdón, necesito ayuda.



I need help.

For example:

Excuse me, I need help.



Gracias.

Por ejemplo:

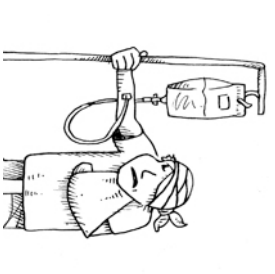
Gracias por su ayuda.



Thank you.

For example:

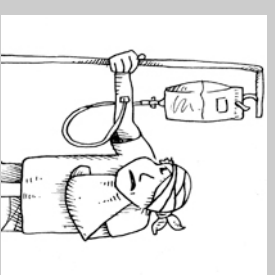
Thank you for your help.



No estoy muy bien.

Por ejemplo:

No estoy muy bien, estoy enfermo.



I'm not very well.

For example:

I'm not very well, I'm sick.



¿Y tú?

Por ejemplo:
Todo bien, ¿y tú?



And you? (casual)

For example:
Everything's great, and you?



Sí.

Por ejemplo:
Sí, me gustaría ir contigo.



Yes.

For example:
Yes, I'd like to go with you.



¡Nos vemos!

Por ejemplo:
Chao, Carmen. ¡Nos vemos!



See ya!

For example:
Goodbye, Carmen. See ya!



Te amo.

Por ejemplo:
Marta, te amo mucho.



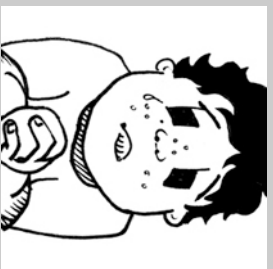
I love you.

For example:
Marta, I love you a lot.



Lo siento.

Por ejemplo:
Lo siento mucho, Margarita.



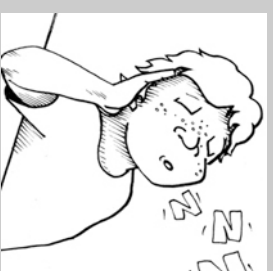
I'm very sorry.

For example:
I'm very sorry, Margarita.



Un poco cansado.

Por ejemplo:
Estoy un poco cansado hoy.



A little tired.

For example:
I'm a little tired today.



¿Y usted?

Por ejemplo:
Estoy muy bien, ¿y usted?



And you? (polite)

For example:
I'm very well, and you?



¿Qué pasa?

Por ejemplo:
Juan, ¡qué sorpresa! ¿Qué pasa?



What's happening?

For example:
Juan, what a surprise!
What's happening?
